

Cancer Services' clinical director retires

A lot has changed in the ten years since Gail Hamm joined Cancer Services of Northeast Indiana as the clinical director.

At that time the agency was still in the old building on E. State Blvd. near Parkview Hospital Randallia and it was known as Cancer Services of Allen County. Since then Cancer Services has moved to a new facility, expanded its service area and changed its name.

"I've had a chance to grow with the agency," Gail said. "In the time I've been here we've expanded from one county to 11. Our goal was to really make the agency world class. We've become the go-to agency for cancer services and have mentored several other agencies across the nation.

"I think we have a marvelous staff. The agency just keeps getting bigger and better and I think we are on the cusp of a major leap. I'm glad that I'll get the opportunity to pass the torch to the next person to take the leap since I was fortunate to be here to take the first one."

But some things have not changed.

One of Gail's least favorite things about her first years at Cancer Services was her office. It was in an inconvenient location and the walls were painted raspberry, which was not her favorite color.

The office Gail will leave on December 31 when she retires is also painted raspberry. However, she said the color now provides her a measure of comfort because it goes well with the beautiful drawing of her daughter that was a gift from hospital staff. It was her daughter, Julie, who inspired her to become a social worker.

Gail has three adult daughters; Amy, Laura and Abby. Her fourth daughter was born with a rare form of muscular dystrophy and died when she was two. She spent much of her life in the neo-natal unit at the old Lutheran Hospital on Fairfield Avenue.

Gail remembers that she had a really good social worker and a really bad social worker trying to help her when she was going through that extremely difficult time in her life.

"I know how important it is as a caregiver to have someone to talk to," said Gail. "You can't change the situation, but you can be there to listen and support."

Gail, who already had a bachelor's degree in medical technology, returned to school to get her master's degree in social work. She became a licensed clinical social worker, received certification as an oncology social worker and has more than 25 years of experience in social work, specializing in grief and bereavement. Before joining Cancer Services she worked at St. Joseph Hospital, Catholic Charities, Erin's House for Grieving Children and Visiting Nurse and Hospice Home.

"It's very much an honor to walk with someone from the first moment they need help, through their illness and sometimes into death," she said. "It's a very sacred thing."

She said that while she has enjoyed all of the places she has worked, Cancer Services has been special because she felt like she was able to use her creativity and that her opinions were truly valued.

"I'm very grateful that I became a social worker and I landed here at the right time," said Gail. "Cancer Services suited me perfectly."

Gail's plans for retirement involve allowing her creative side more time to flourish. She recently participated in the Artist's Way workshop series, which was a partnership between Cancer Services and Artworks Galleria. The workshops were based on Julia Cameron's international best-selling book, "The Artist's Way," and involved hands-on exercises to help reduce the barriers to creativity.

"I'm going to clean my house and I'm going to play, but not necessarily in that order," said Gail. "I'm going to create. I've got some projects, some painting and some building projects I want to tackle. Some of these will require skills that I don't have yet. So, I'm going to take advantage of some of the educational programs in the community."

All of us at Cancer Services would like to congratulate Gail and thank her for many years of dedicated service to our clients and to the community.

Financial Coach Program

Cancer Services received a grant from the Foundation for Financial Planning to start a Financial Coach Program for our clients. We were one of just two cancer agencies in the country that received this grant.

The goal of the program is to provide free individual financial coaching services to clients and their caregivers. It will make expert financial information available to our clients who otherwise would not be able to afford such services because they are already maxed out financially and stressed by their cancer diagnosis.

Who are our financial coaches? Cancer Services has eight trained volunteer financial coaches. They are CPA's and certified financial advisors and all of them are successful business people from our community. How are referrals to the program initiated? Clients who are interested in meeting with a financial coach will get a referral from their client advocate. Before meeting with the coach their client advocate will help them complete a financial assessment form, which will give the coach an idea of what help is needed.

The coaches can give clients information to help with budgeting, debt management, estate planning and insurance issues.

re-Energize Support Group

Group now meets every Monday and Thursday from 5:30-6:30 p.m.

Please feel free to join the class at any time. This is a very low impact exercise class designed for individuals currently in treatment or post treatment. Each person is evaluated and the class is adapted to their particular capability level.

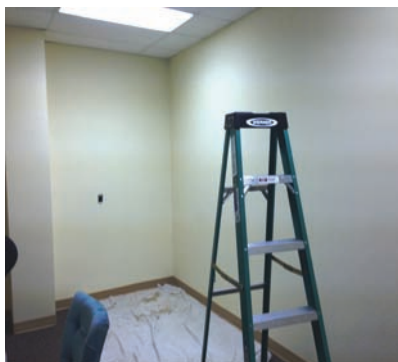

Donating Stock

This time of the year it is not uncommon for the better angels of our nature to begin whispering to us about the importance of demonstrating charity and love for our neighbors. Charitable giving is a basic tenant of good financial stewardship that every savvy investor should understand.

Pulling out your checkbook or reaching for your credit card is the most common way for the philanthropically minded to support the valuable work of a well vetted nonprofit (Cancer Services of Northeast Indiana, for example). However, in certain circumstances a gift of appreciated stock offers a prudent way to invest for the greater good.

Donating stock can be the ultimate win/win situation. In addition to experiencing gratification from helping others, the donor benefits because they are able to deduct the full value of the asset on their taxes and do not have to pay capital gains tax on the appreciation of the stock. The nonprofit benefits because they receive the benefit of the gift and will not have to pay taxes on any gains if the stock is subsequently sold.

Donating stock to charity is not an investment strategy reserved for the Bill Gates and Warren Buffet's of the world. It's a strategy that has potential benefit for your tax bill regardless of whether the stock you donate is worth \$100 or \$1 million.

Here is an example of how it works:

Like all good examples, we need to lay out some assumptions. For this one, let us assume you wish to divest stock you have held for more than a year and your cost basis (CB) is half of the current market value (MV). In addition, we are going to assume that you are in the 25% Federal Tax Bracket and any Long Term Capital Gains are taxed at 20% (15% Federal & 5% State).

In our first scenario, you sell \$1,000 of stock and donate the proceeds to your favorite non-profit. You will owe \$100 in Long Term Capital Gains tax [20% of \$500 (\$1,000 MV - \$500 CB)] and receive a charitable deduction for a tax savings of \$250 [25% of \$1,000]. Your favorite non-profit has received \$1,000 and your out of pocket expense is \$850 [\$1,000 + \$100 - \$250].

In our second scenario, you donate \$1,133 of stock directly to your favorite non-profit. You will owe nothing in Long Term Capital Gains tax and you will receive a larger charitable deduction for a tax savings of \$283 [25% of \$1,133]. Your favorite non-profit has now received \$1,133 and your out of pocket expense is still \$850 [\$1,133 - 283].

In our final scenario, you donate \$1,000 of stock directly to your favorite non-profit. You will owe nothing in Long Term Capital Gains tax and you will receive a charitable deduction for a tax savings of \$250 [25% of \$1,000]. Your favorite non-profit has still received \$1,000 and your out of pocket expense has dropped to \$750 [\$1,000 - \$250].

But there are some things you need to know before donating stocks. Stock shares owned for a year or less are considered income property for tax purposes and the charitable deduction would be limited to the cost of the stock. You should make sure the shares have been held for more than one year and qualify for the "qualified appreciated stock" deduction. To receive the full benefit of donating stock you will need to itemize your deductions. Donors should also investigate whether taking advantage of the tax benefit will cause alternative minimum tax concerns.

It's always wise to check with your financial planner and a tax professional before making a charitable contribution of stock to stay on solid ground with the IRS.

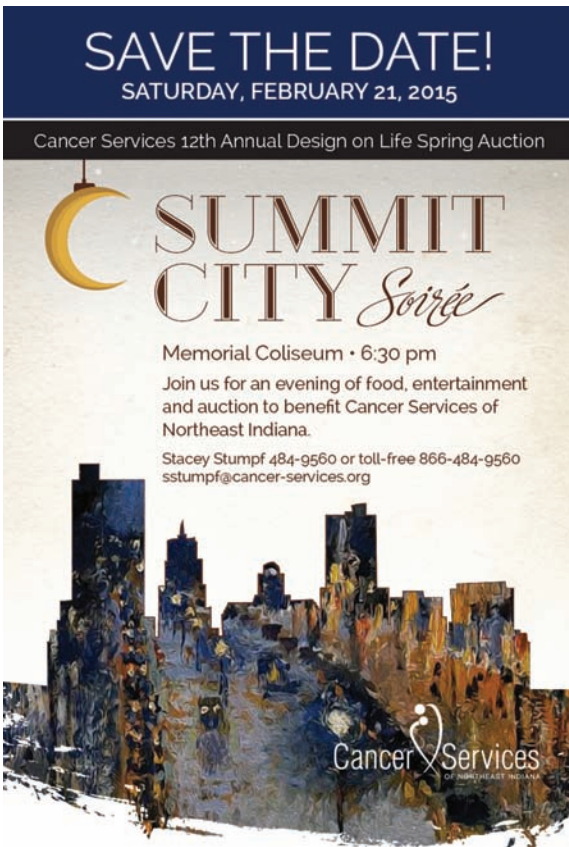
Meanwhile, Noni has accepted the position of Marketing and Events Coordinator. She will be responsible for planning Cancer Services' special events and helping with marketing efforts.
